

# TLC Top Ten Talking Tips

10 top tips to help your child become a confident communicator!

- Say your child's name first as this will gain their attention.
- **Get down to your child's level** so they can see your face when you speak.
- Follow your child's lead so they know you are interested in what they are doing.
- Make more comments and ask less questions as this will help build their vocabulary.
- Comment on what your child is doing and what you are doing to help them learn new words.
- **Speak in short sentences** to help them understand what you are saying.

- Repeat back what your child says to model language and let them know you are listening.
- Pause to give your child time to think, give your child at least 10 seconds to process information.
- Use gestures when you are talking as this will give your child extra clues to help them understand what you are saying.
- Sing songs and share stories every day.
   This will give your child confidence as they become more familiar with them.





Bought a currant bun and took it away.


Four currant buns...
